#### FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

The parable of the Prodigal Son is a favorite in the Christian scriptures. One reason is its proclamation of 'unconditional love'. The wayward son did not promise anything in return for the father's forgiveness, he just admitted his sin and CAME HOME. He said: 'I'm sorry'.

For Bro. David Steindl-Rast, the prayer of *Thanksgiving* is very important. Perhaps, a second very important prayer, is to ask forgiveness for not being *thankful* enough. Like the prodigal, we waste so many of the gifts we've been given. Gratitude and repentance melt the heart of God.
