

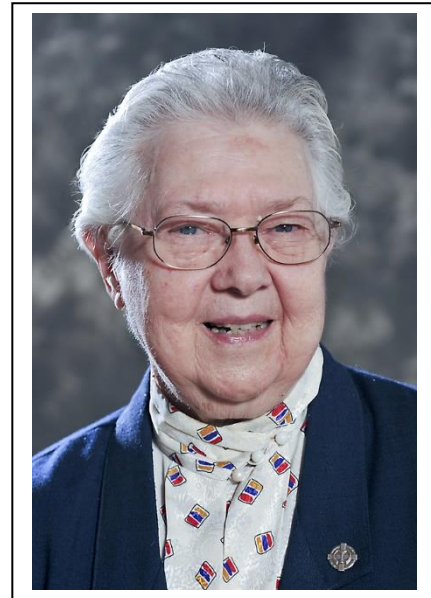

**Sister Mary Naomi Curtin, SSND
Former teacher, principal and educational consultant**

Elm Grove, Wisconsin – Sister Mary Naomi Curtin, SSND, died Wednesday, December 13, at Our Lady of the Angels in Milwaukee. She was 93, and a former teacher, principal and educational consultant.

The memorial Mass was celebrated December 20 at Notre Dame of Elm Grove in Elm Grove, Wisconsin. Burial was at Notre Dame of Elm Grove Cemetery.

Sister Naomi was born in Marshfield, Wisconsin. She entered the congregation of the School Sisters of Notre Dame in 1940, and professed first vows in 1943 and final vows in 1949.



She earned a bachelor's degree in education and history from Mount Mary College in Milwaukee, a Master's of Education from Marquette University in Milwaukee and a Ph.D. in education from the University of Oregon in Eugene, Oregon.

Sister Naomi began her teaching ministry at St. Michael School in Milwaukee. She continued teaching at St. Francis, San Vicente and Notre Dame High School in Guam; Messmer High School in Milwaukee; St. John the Baptist in Savage, Minnesota; and Our Lady of Peace in Marshfield and Holy Angels in West Bend, both in Wisconsin. She was a principal at Marinette Catholic Central High School in Marinette, Wisconsin, and a professor at the University of Oregon. She also served as a teacher and coordinator for Silva Mind Growth, Inc., in Mount Calvary, Wisconsin, and a lecturer for Silva International, Inc., in Dakota, Minnesota.

After 15 years of community service at Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Mount Calvary, Wisconsin, she was transferred to Our Lady of the Angels in Milwaukee.

Sister Naomi is survived by two brothers, Richard L. and Jerome Curtin, and two sisters, Mary Ellen Geoffroy and Marleen Tucker.
