
About the film

In 2015, Pope Francis wrote *Laudato Si'*; an encyclical letter about the environmental crisis to every single person in the world. A few years later, four voices that have gone unheard in global conversations have been invited to an unprecedented dialogue with the Pope. Hailing from Senegal, the Amazon, India, and Hawaii, they bring perspective and solutions from the poor, the indigenous, the youth, and wildlife into a conversation with Pope Francis himself. This documentary follows their journey to Rome and the extraordinary experiences that took place there, and is packed with powerfully moving personal stories alongside the latest information about the planetary crisis and the toll it's taking on nature and people.

The film is 80 minutes long. Please note, the film does contain subtitles. Subtitles are available in English, Italian, Spanish, French and Portuguese.



Laudato Si' encourages us to see how "everything is connected." The way we treat the Earth, our common home, is a reflection of how we treat each other. Caring for each other means caring for the home we share.



Before the Film

Before watching the film, take a moment for reflection or prayer. Read Scripture or a quotation from Laudato Si' aloud. If you are with others, ask them to reflect silently for one minute and then share how their faith has called them to attend this event.

You may want to consider readings such as "Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth" (Isaiah 40:28) or "We have forgotten that we ourselves are dust of the earth [cf. Gen 2:7]; our very bodies are made up of her elements, we breathe her air and we receive life and refreshment from her waters." (Laudato Si', 2)

After the Film

When the film is finished, sit quietly for one minute, reflecting on what you have seen and how you feel called to contribute to the better future we are building together. If you are with a group, you may consider offering the following quotation as a prompt for reflection:

“Whether believers or not, we agree today that the earth is essentially a shared inheritance, whose fruits are meant to benefit everyone.”

(*Laudato Si'*, 93)

Reflection prompts:

- How did the film make you feel? What is your key takeaway from the film?
- How does Catholic social teaching encourage us to take our personal contributions to the ecological crisis seriously?
- The film encourages us to take action. Why is taking action important?
- What actions can we as a community take to protect our common home?
