God's Promises

Every year, in this holy season of Advent, we are given four weeks (and this year, only three!) to prepare to welcome Jesus – God with us! The amazing reality is that even as we prepare and wait, **God is already with us.**



In scripture we are reminded of calls that came forth and promises made:

- "The Lord said to Abram: Go forth from your land, your relatives, and from your father's house to a land that I will show you. I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you...Is anything too marvelous for the Lord to do?... Abraham was old, having seen many days, and the Lord had blessed him in every way." Genesis 12:1; 18:14; 24:1
- "The word of the Lord came to me: Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you. 'Ah, Lord God!' I said, 'I do not know how to speak. I am too young!' But the Lord answered me, Do not say, 'I am too young.' To whomever I send you, you shall go; whatever I command you, you shall speak...Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you..." Jeremiah 1

In Advent and Christmas readings we are reminded of these **promises**:

- "The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. In verdant pastures he gives me repose; Beside restful
 waters he leads me; he refreshes my soul... I shall dwell in the house of the Lord for years to come."
 Psalm 23
- "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his mercy endures forever..." Psalm 116
- "Thus says the Lord God...The Lord will give you the bread you need and the water for which you thirst..." Isaiah 30
